## **Facility Profile: Iowa Equestrian Center at Kirkwood**





Liz Lindner has been a part of the team at the <u>lowa Equestrian Center at Kirkwood</u> since 2008 and she took the reins as manager in 2017.

Liz has a passion for all things equestrian, having experience in a variety of disciplines. Today, she still finds time to ride her Hanoverian-Thoroughbred mare in between her time as a facility manager and mom of two. "I grew up participating in 4-H and competing in local shows," Liz shared. "When I was younger, I did mainly reining and barrel racing. During my college years at North Dakota State University, I was part of their Intercollegiate Horse Show Association team and got introduced to jumping. I love my job because I get to combine my background in events with my equestrian knowledge."

The Iowa Equestrian Center at Kirkwood prides itself of its unique design, allowing equestrians to compete in a horse show without ever having to step outdoors. "We cater to the comfort of riders and

horses and the exhibitor experience is our emphasis," Liz said. "The way our facility is laid out is unique because everything is under one roof – the stall barn, show arena, and seating area. During the cold lowa winters, exhibitors can stay warm and comfortable."

While the equestrian center mainly hosts horse shows, they also hold several other events. "We have had cattle shows and we just hosted the National Llama Show," Liz added. "We have around 250 permanent stalls with the ability to set up overflow barns, which allows us to accommodate a variety of events."

Running a large facility that hosts many events, Liz has found The League to be a wealth of knowledge and resources. "I've learned so much from attending The League Symposiums. My first Symposium was back in 2011 in Lexington," she recounted. "It has been a great opportunity to network and meet managers from across the nation. All the facilities have similar challenges, so it's important to be able to pick up the phone or send an email to another facility manager. As members of The League, we can bounce solutions off each other and celebrate our successes together."

#### Getting in Touch with Your CVB

Ray Holt, President of the Tulsa Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) & Tulsa Sports Commission joined us at the 2019 League Symposium to lead a session on how to connect with your CVB. Ray offered a variety of tips to consider when promoting your facility within the community:

- Visitors are beneficial for the economic impact of the community. For instance, a day visitor may generate \$60 in revenue while an overnight visitor will generate \$200.
- Incentivize people to stay overnight.
- Connect with lodging and restaurants nearby: often restaurants will provide gift cards to bring visitors into their restaurants.
- Let the local community know about events at your facility.
- Invite your CVB to the events sometimes they will bring coffee, donuts, and hospitality.
- Consider hosting a VIP event, giving locals a behind-the-scenes tour of your facility.
- Collect data from the visitors who come to your facility: where are they from are they staying in a hotel, and how many nights they are staying in town.
- Create strategic relationships with the area penetrate local associations with information about your events.
