Concession Food & Beverage

Presented by Rey O'Day of Wings of Fame Productions

Rey O'Day from Wings of Fame Productions explained how owning and operating a concession stand yourself gives you more control over the customer experience, but hiring an external catering company takes the burden of risk off the facility. When planning concession services are some important factors to consider:

- Keep everything as affordable as possible for the consumer by knowing which foods are most cost effective.
- Food safety needs to the highest the priority. Make sure everything is stored at the correct temperatures and employees wash their hands.

- Make sure trash is disposed of properly and recyclables are well-labeled.
- Lastly, don't forget to smile and make eye contact with customers.



Board Member Profile: Brandi Herndon

Brandi Herdon has been a member of the League for over a decade and she's also the Agri-Business Manager at Expo Square in Tulsa, Ok., where the League will be hosting its 2019 Annual Symposium.

"In January, we are going to host the League Symposium," she said. "It will be our first time hosting the event and we are very excited to showcase our recently renovated 240-acre facility. We are proud to be one of the largest complexes in the country, hosting a wide variety of horse and livestock events, such as the United States Arabian National Show and World Pinto Show. Including our new barn and flexible set-ups, we have the capacity to accommodate upward of 3,000 stalls. We also host other events and consumer shows, including the Tulsa RV and Boat Show and even many high school graduations."

Brandi, who has been working at Expo Square for about 16 years, feels quite a passion for agriculture and livestock. "I grew up showing cattle and horses," she explained. "I have always been passionate about the livestock industry. It has just turned into a career for me. When I was younger I showed livestock at the state and local levels. Then I went to Oklahoma State where I majored in Agribusiness. Upon graduation, there was an opening at Expo Square in the livestock fair department to process entries, and the rest is history." Today, Brandi raises cattle with her husband, Bart, and two young daughters.

Being a member of the League has helped Brandi forge many valuable connections. "Networking and relationships are so important in this industry," Brandi said. "I remember even at one of the first Symposiums I attended, I made connections with people from the Oklahoma State Fair Park. Now, if I'm facing a problem or have a question about facility management, I can pick up the phone and call other people I've met through the League."
